"[T]he word and he who utters it cannot be the same person. . . . [T]wo different things are present, and . . . the speaker is not the word and, also, . . . the word is not the speaker; but rather . . . the word comes from the speaker, and it has its nature not from itself, but from the speaker and . . . on the other hand, the speaker does not come from the word nor derive his nature from it but from himself" (Martin Luther, LW: 52:43).

- 1. The *speaker* is different from the *word*.
- 2. The word as *entitling* is different from the word as *empowering*.
- 3. The Christian symbol for the speaker is "Father," while the Christian symbols for the word as entitling and the world as empowering are respectively "Son" and "Spirit."

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
