Whitehead says: "Process is the becoming of experience" (PRc: 166 [252]).

But I say, on the contrary, No, the converse is true: the becoming of experience is process—more exactly the palmary instance of process more or less clearly given in experience.

Process itself, on the other hand, is *concrescence*, which is to say, the becoming, not of experience, but of concreteness.
