

*More on "Possible Worlds"*

Instead of simply avoiding the term "possible worlds," why not use it, the while explaining that a possible world is more or less indeterminate and so really a *kind* of world(s), any one of which kind, if and when it becomes actual, will be fully determinate, and so indefinitely more determinate than the kind as such?
