

"owned by Mr. C. W. Vanranst was imported by Abraham Ogden Esq. in the year 1819. He was bred at Bussorah on the Banks of the Euphrates at the head of the Persian Gulph, and thence carried to Bombay by H. Colquhoun the English East India Company's Agent, under whose eye he was bred and of whom he was purchased by Mr. Ogden. He is of the Germany Breed a cast held in the highest estimation by the Arabs and we are assured by travellers that the Horses brought from Bussorah are considered incomparable. His colour is a beautiful Sorrel his figure justly proportioned and for bone and muscle and fine action is a matchless animal"
