He is of the Germany Breed a cast held in the highest estimation by the Arabs and we are assured by travellers that the Horses brought from Bussorah are considered incomparable. His colour is a beautiful Sorrel his figure justly proportioned and for bone and muscle and fine action is a matchless animal"
